

Power plant construction now at 60%

Sixty percent of the work for the first unit of the 2 x 150 MW coal fired power plant currently under construction in Maamba was completed by the end of December, 2013.

This shows that the project is on schedule with the commissioning of the first unit which will supply 150 Mega Watts (MW) of power to ZESCO for onward transmission to the Zambian consumers, slated in the last quarter of 2014.

MCL will supply electricity to ZESCO at Muzuma sub-station via a 330 KV double circuit line, currently under construction, for on-ward transmission to the Zambian market.

The company has also made tremendous progress on the other two key power plant related

projects, with the construction of the water pipe line from Lake Kariba to Maamba well on course.

MCL enters 2014 with Zero fatalities

aamba Collieries Limited (MCL) has entered the year 2014 with zero fatalities since March 2010 when excavation for coal and power plant construction started.

This is a demonstration of the company's maintenance of high safety standards. The record fits within the parameters set out by Government through the Mine Safety Department under the Ministry of Mines and Minerals Development.

MCL management has insisted on safety tips for each shift and also contractors and visitors to the mine and the power plant construction area. Environment and Safety Officer Andrew Tembo said his team will not compromise on safety.

MCL seeks to maintain this record until both units of the power plant are commissioned. Even under the mining department, the company has been digging for coal using modern equipment without any fatalities.

MCL aims at providing a safe and healthy workplace to protect all the employees, sub-contractors, visitors, service providers and physical assets from damage and wastage.

To achieve this, the Company creates awareness on the safety requirements at every operation while ensuring that all the employees receive necessary training in safety procedures.

MCL also provides resources to maximize safe work practices and identifies hazards in the workplace and addresses them as a priority above all else to reduce or eliminate the risk of injury or harm to the employees.

Maamba Collieries Limited (MCL) has made further progress in preparing the drainage for the passage of the water pipe line from Lake Kariba to the power plant.

The pipe line will supply water which will operate the power plant. The MCL contractors, SEPCO and GKC-SRR have lined

the pipe line from Maamba to Kariba while the digging is going on for the passage of the water pipeline.


To protect the environment and the ecology of the rivers, the company has sunk the pipe lines deep under the rivers so that water flows undisturbed.


MCL Step-by-step with CSR
