



# Looking back and ahead; the MCL perspectives

Mit's mining capabilities to increase productivity beyond it's projected 800,000 tonnes of coal per year. This will be done through recapitalisation. In the recent years productivity dropped substantially for over a period of time until MCL invested in revamping systems. Previously, lack of investment in the mine generally affected productivity and the welfare of the people of Maamba to a larger extent.

The Government of the Republic of Zambia seeks to advance the social and economic development

through private sector investment, is the main thrust for the people of Sinazongwe in response to the government policy to create meaningful jobs.

Maamba Collieries Limited (MCL) is jointly owned by the Government of the Republic of Zambia which holds 35 per cent shares through the ZCCM-Investment Holdings. Nava Bharat of Singapore, on the other hand, holds the remaining 65 per cent shares.

For many years, MCL has operated as a loss-making entity because it was regarded as a service provider posture of Sinazongwe district and, to some extent, that of Southern province.

With the new investment, the economic turn-around for the district and company have comeforth with the new owners investing USD 800 million to mordenise the mine and precipitate economic fortunes of the province and particularly that of Sinazongwe.

Presently, about 30 per cent of the combined works related to the construction of the power plant have been achieved and

the construction works have been intensified in order to meet the deadline of October 2014 when the company will contribute the first 150 Mega Watts of electricity to the national grid.



aamba Collieries Limited (MCL) is on schedule with the construction of the USD 800 million coal-powered thermal electricity generation plant at its cite in Sinazongwe District of Southern province. The construction of the first ever coal plant in Zambia is being fast-tracked via the fifteen contracted companies that are carrying out shared and specialised works ahead of the October 2014 next year when the plant will off-load its first power Mega Watt to the Zambian population through Zesco limited.

SEPCO Electric Power Construction Company is the Engineering Procurement and Construction (EPC) contractor for the construction of the main power plant. The company was given a Notice To Proceed (NTP) on 26th March, 2012 and has done massive work since then.

There are two units under construction at Maamba. One is expected to be completed in October 2014 while the second one would be commissioned early 2015.

The company has also been engaged to construct a 330 KV double circuit transmission line from Maamba to Muzuma sub-station owned by Zesco limited. This is the point at which Maamba Energy Coal plant will offload its power into the national grid.

The double circuit transmission line will run a total distance of 46 kilometers from Maamba to Muzuma.

Mamba Collieries Limited is located in the southern province of Zambia in the mining town of Maamba about 352km from the capital Lusaka.

The company was incorporated as a limited company in 1971 under the ownership of the Government through the Zambia Industrial and Mining Corporation (ZIMCO).

Implementation Agreement between Government of the Republic of Zambia through the Ministry of Energy and Water Development and Maamba Collieries was signed on 16 September 2011.

The Zambian Government selected

Nava Bharat as the strategic and technical partner for ZCCM-IH to revamp and develop the existing Maamba Coal Mine for the purpose of producing and supplying coal to the new coal-fired power plant and selling coal domestically and internationally.

The project will be developed under Public Private Partnership (PPP) with ZCCM-IH) representing the Government of Zambia. This was done on a Build, Own and Operate (BOO) basis.

The project will have an installed capacity of 300MW at an estimated cost of USD800 million.

MCL is in the process of constructing a coal-powered electricity generation plant in Maamba with the aim of contributing 300 Mega Watts in the initial stages but it is envisaged that another 300 MW will be commissioned afterwards depending on demand.

# 1,280 Maamba residents screened and treated during the MCL-sponsored free medical camp

Atotal of 1, 280 residents in Sinazongwe district were screened and treated during the two free medical screening and treatment camps that were sponsored by Maamba Collieries Limited.

The company screened and treated 873 citizens on Wednesday May 15, 2013. Out of the 90 malaria tests carried out, 45 were positive and provided with treatment by the medical team.

The same number of people was

tested for malaria during the earlier medical camp at Sinankumbi primary school in May when, again 45 of them tested positive to malaria.

For MCL, this is an indication that malaria cases need more attention and it is a challenge that we must do more. The company does not intend to stop this exercise because corporate social responsibility is high on the list of our priorities.

The company is grateful that His Honor the Vice President Dr Guy Scott

delivered an inspiring message when he addressed the people and also for the presence of his wife Charlotte who was the guest of honor.

Maamba Collieries Limited also donated 250 high quality blankets to Maamba hospital and they were handed over to the hospital management by Mrs Scott.

Cervical cancer screening and eye tests would form part of the next phase of the medical camp following the huge demand for the two services.

MCL is aware that many services need to be provided to the community in and around Maamba and we want to make a genuine effort to provide them in due course but what makes us happier is that the exercise has started. The beneficiaries of the program were particularly impressed with our initiative to meet the health needs of the community.


## Free medical screening in pictures

#### 1,280 Maamba residents screened and treated during the MCL-sponsored free medical camp



The decision to sponsor a free medical camp at Maamba private school is in line with the company's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) to reach out to the underprivileged people in the communities.

MCL wishes to express sincere gratitude to the doctors and the rest of the medical team that worked long hours to ensure that all the patients that turned up for treatment got the attention they needed.

The launch of the programme was witnessed by 15 Ministers' spouses, led by Mrs Scott. Later in the day, the community was joined by Dr Scott who was accompanied by Southern Province Minister Hon. Daniel Munkombwe, Deputy Minister of Commerce, Trade and Industry, Hon. Richwell Siamunene, who is also Sinazongwe Member of Parliament.

Also in attendance at the event was Maamba Collieries Limited Board Chairman Mr. Ashok Devineni, Resident Director – Mr. Ashwin Devineni and other MCL members of the Board of Directors and MCL Management.

Receiving the donation on behalf of the club, Mrs Scott appreciated the gesture and said "Thank you for the generous donation to our club."

"We will put it towards our programme of rehabilitation of mothers' and relatives' shelters at Provincial hospitals throughout the country."

"The shelters to be constructed by the Ministers' Spouses Club will allow expectant mothers and relatives attending to patients to be accommodated at the hospital, which is particularly necessary for more serious cases that are referred from district level facilities," Mrs Scott added.

Maamba Collieries mobilized four medical doctors for the exercise covering four (4) areas that included gynecology, surgical, dental and general body conditions.

The Surgeon attended to 73 cases of mainly hernia and growths. Out of the 73 cases, 13 were recommended for operation and further attention at Maamba Hospital.

The Gynecologist attended to 74 cases out of which 5 were referred to Monze General Hospital while the Dentist saw 44 cases and most them were referred to Maamba hospital for teeth extraction.

The forward-looking free mobile medical screening and treatment initiative seeks to add another profile to the wide-reaching corporate social responsibility programme of MCL.

Earlier, another medical camp was launched on Sunday May 5, 2013 at a

distantly located village of Sinankumbi where 405 residents were screened and treated of various ailments.

The company has a registered Maamba Development Trust which is responsible for coordinating, financing and managing various activities for the benefit of the residents.

This is meant to reach out to the vast majority in villages who are not able to reach health facilities due to long distance, lack of finances, old age and other limiting factors.

The launch of the programme in Sinankumbi was witnessed by a senior government official, the deputy minister in charge of Commerce, Trade and Industry Hon Richwell Siamunene who is also the Member of Parliament for the local constituency, Sinazongwe.

Others in the delegation were Mr Dodo Sindaza who is Sinazongwe District Commissioner, Dr Chilembo the Sinazongwe District Medical Officer, Mr Cliff Siachibweka, Sinazongwe Council Chairperson, Mr Reuben Kasongola, the councilor for Sinankumbi Area and several headmen from within Sinankumbi area.

# The Eye Clinic at the University Teaching Hospital, in Lusaka, Zambia funded by Nava Bharat Ventures Limited at a Cost of USD 500,000.



Nava Bharat Ventures Limited — which owns 65% shares in Maamba Collieries Limited (MCL) — has invested ZMW 2, 700,000 (USD 500,000) in the construction of the Eye Clinic in Zambia's capital, Lusaka as a major step towards its wide-reaching Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).

The company has chosen Health and Education as focus areas for discharging investment in the needs of the community.

Nava Bharat has specifically identified Eye Care as a pressing need of the society and decided to support organizations providing high quality eye care.

LV Prasad Eye Institute (LVPEI), which has been rendering world-class eye care services in India, has therefore been a natural choice to partner with. Nava Bharat has been supporting LVPEI in its various activities since inception and this support has now been extended to Zambia.

Through OEU, we learnt about the project for establishing an Eye Centre at the University Teaching Hospital (UTH) in Lusaka.
