Message by the Chief Executive Officer



The New Year started for Maamba Collieries on a bright note with both units of 2X150 MW Thermal Power Plant continuing to generate full power.

The rains did not affect our operations both in the Power Plant and in the Coal Mine. The mining activities continue to be conducted efficiently to meet the demands of correct quality coal for the Thermal Power Plant and also for our customers outside.

MCL reconstruction of Maaamba Roads near completion

The reconstruction of township roads in Maamba is nearing completion, with 4.3 kilometres of the planned 5.1 kilometres completed by end June, signaling the end of the first part of the project.

In August 2017, Maamba Collieries Limited had launched its wholly-funded reconstruction of township roads in Maamba at a cost of Kwacha 20 million. The freshly laid roads with well-designed embankments will greatly benefit the community, who in the past, have had to navigate through deep potholes and worn-out roads that had not seen even basic maintenance since construction around four decades ago.



According to the MCL Civil Engineering Department, responsible for supervising this programme being undertaken with technical support from Bicon Zambia Limited, Phase I of the road works is almost complete, with less than a kilometre remaining. This is expected to be completed by the time this newsletter goes to print.

This major reconstruction programme involving relaying of the road network in Maamba is the flagship of MCL's Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives.

Meanwhile, a number of key government officials have hailed MCL's initiative to reconstruct the township roads in Maamba as a model for community investment by foreign multinational companies.

On his first-ever visit to Maamba Collieries as Minister of Mines and Minerals Development, Hon. Richard Musukwa, MP said there was need for other investors, especially in the mining sector to emulate MCL's CSR programmes, especially the road works which benefit the community.

Minister of Commerce, Trade and Industry Hon. Christopher Yaluma, MP said the MCL's CSR programme epitomised by the road reconstruction project is admirable as it reflects the kind of investments Zambia needs.

MCL commemorates World Environment Day

MCL last June along with Maamba residents joined the rest of the global community in observing the World Environment Day by cleaning the township of all plastics and simultaneously planted saplings around the township, aimed at greening the surroundings.

The 5th of June every year is designated by the United Nations as World Environment Day, a day set aside since 1974 to promote *"worldwide awareness and action for the protection of our environment."*

This year, India was the global host of the World Environment Day commemoration with the theme "Beat Plastic Pollution" as the world is coming together to combat the dangers and menace of plastic pollution.

At Maamba, MCL mobilized its employees, civic leaders, the Maamba Community and pupils from different schools in the area to commemorate this important event.

General Manager Mining, Mr. David Vijay Kumar said there is need to protect the environment from the harmful effects of plastic pollution which, apart from damaging the earth, was also endangering the safety of human and marine life.

Meanwhile, Head of the Thermal Power Plant, Mr. Ranga Rao, speaking at the event, informed the participants that the 300-MW Plant, employing latest technologies, was designed to reduce direct and indirect emissions to barest minimal levels to avoid degradation of the environment, and that emission standards were as per WHO norms.

Maamba Ward Councilor, Mr. Zachariah Chikete said there is need for MCL to maintain its standard on environment protection and management practices.

Mr. Chikete also urged MCL to increase its initiatives of sensitizing Maamba residents on the need to embrace environmental best practices like cutting out the use of plastic bags in their day-to-day lives.

During the event, MCL awarded some of its employees for writing best essays interpreting this year's World Environment Day theme, a gesture which was extended to pupils from the various schools in Maamba area.

As a way of sustaining solid waste management in the area, MCL also donated refuse collection bins to the local authorities. This was a follow up to last year, when, MCL donated a brand new 30-tonne Sino Tipper Truck and a Back Hoe Loader – worth Kwacha 1.2 million, to help Sinazongwe District Council in solid waste management in the area.

The Hon'ble Minister was speaking during a one day tour of the MCL. He was accompanied by

Mr. Perry Mapani, Director General - Zambia Development Agency and other officials from the Ministry of Commerce, Trade & Industry.

Hon. Yaluma, MP said the operationalisation of MCL's 300 – MW coal-fired Thermal Power Plant, the only plant of its kind in Zambia, was an integral cog in the Government's plans.

The Minister explained that the processes of Maamba Collieries are an important model for the industrialization agenda, a core component of the 7th National Development Plan.

He said while the Government is currently focused on manufacturing and agro-processing as the main drivers of the industrialization agenda, it also recognizes that mines continue to play a key role in Zambia's economy, especially where mining processes included value - addition.

"We are geared up to transform Zambia into an industrialized economy and it is operations like Maamba Collieries that we see being at the centre of this transformation," Hon. Yaluma said.

During the period when he served concurrently as Minister of Energy and Minister of Mines & Minerals Development, Hon. Yaluma, MP had been one of the key GRZ officials who supported the idea and backed the actualisation of MCL's 300-MW coalfired Thermal Power Plant.

"MCL is not just mining coal and selling it; there is this Thermal Power Plant which is running on some of the coal from the Pits. MCL is supporting the Zambian economy and at the same time creating wealth for Zambians through backward linkages with local suppliers," he said.

"It is important that the pronouncement of the Government policy as envisaged in the 7th National Development Plan – that is diversification and also industrialization are very much here at Maamba," Hon. Yaluma, MP added.

Hon. Yaluma, MP hailed the positive impact MCL's investment is making on the Zambian economy as well as transforming the economic status of Maamba.

"Last time I came here was when this place was under construction, but now it's fully operating and it has changed the profile of Maamba, including employees," he added.

Hon. Yaluma, MP last visited Maamba Collieries in 2014, when he witnessed the sendoff of 18 Zambian trainee engineers to India and China for on-site training in power plant operations and maintenance to promote technical skills transfer and enhance the capability of young Zambian engineers. Meanwhile, MCL CEO, Rear Admiral Venkat Shankar (Retd), said the history of the revival of the MCL operations at Maamba and subsequent construction of the TPP can never be complete without mentioning Hon. Yaluma's role in this transformation.

This is a true investment supporting government policy as regard to value addition thus creating employment and producing end product (electricity) from coal being mined and supporting the Zambian economy. ast March, Hon. Musukwa, MP led an entourage from the Ministry of Mines and Minerals Development, which included the Permanent Secretary, Mr. Paul Chanda and other senior officials, on a two-day official visit to MCL.

The Minister toured key operational sites – the Thermal Power Plant, the open Mine Pits – Izuma A and Izuma B, and also witnessed the Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives being undertaken by MCL in Maamba.

Hon. Musukwa, MP who was visiting MCL operational sites for the visit time as the Minister of Mines and Minerals Development, expressed happiness with the operations and the impact of the US \$ 919-million investment, both on the economic status of Maamba as well as the preservation of the environment.
